What we have learned about prayer in this series so far:

- Prayer changes what is possible for God to do in our world.
- Fasting accelerates our prayers.

Fasting is a prophetic act that demonstrates your hunger for God and your submission to him.

- Intercession is the act of bringing two parties together, bridging a gap, making a connection.

Question: What are some of the challenges and questions you have or have had about prayer?

Problems people have with prayer:

- What if I pray the wrong thing?

God has left Himself a discretionary power [in prayer]. Had He not done so, prayer would be an activity too dangerous for man.

- What if I don't know what to pray for?

We have been given a prayer partner to help us pray.

Read: Romans 8:26-27; Daniel 4:8–9

The same Holy Spirit that was in Daniel is in you.

Questions: What makes you doubt this is true for you? What makes you confident that this is true for you?

Read: Acts 2

One of the most important roles of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer is to help us to pray with power, accuracy and anointing.

Read: 1 Corinthians 14:1-25; Romans 8:26–27

Praying in tongues seems like gibberish; however, many of our prayers in English are gibberish because we are praying from our natural understanding and minds and we miss the supernatural.

When we don't know how to pray, the Holy Spirit does!

Read again: Acts 2:38

Questions: What has your experience been with tongues? If you have been baptized in the Holy Spirit, what is one change you will make that will “stir it up” inside of you? If you have never spoken in tongues, when will you set aside time wherever you are at to ask for and receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit?
