Question: The "old King" in our lives is Satan and the forces of darkness. How has the experience of the "old King" not letting you go been in your life?

• It gets worse because your old life doesn't want to let you go.

Questions: What from you "old life" doesn't want to let you go? Where are you at in the "process of freedom?"
