Questions: If you watch movies, what is the usual way that you watch them? Why? Besides piracy, where have you seen the definition of "right and wrong" shift?

Question: How do the three items in 1 John 2:16 show up with Adam and Eve in Genesis 3 and Jesus in Luke 4?

- 2. List of Do's and Do Not's **Read** 1John 2:15

Read John 16:33

Read Matthew 5:14,16

Question: What "grade" would you give yourself on how you are living your life with this image of the church?

The church is a community of deep relational ties in a culture of individualism and isolation.
