Question: What is the most embarrassing time that you have walked into the wrong door, washroom, or vehicle?

Read John 10:7-9

**Lots of people have opinions about who Jesus is.
But Jesus didn't leave room for opinions.**

The sheepfold was about security, protection and being "home".

In our post-modern contemporary age a lot of people think:

- all religions are basically the same
- all religions have an equal claim on the truth
- all religions lead to the same place
- the big problem with the Christian religion is that it's exclusive

**"I am the door" is not about being exclusive,
it's about radical inclusivity.**

Read John 9:1-34 – this is the context of Jesus' claim to be the door.

Question: When and how have you experienced being marginalized?

Read John 9:35-38

The story continues into John 10.

**To enter the sheepfold is to come home
When Jesus says "I'm the door", it's not to keep you
out, it's so that you can find a way in.**

Read John 10:9-10

Questions: How do you answer Jesus asking you the question: "Do you believe in me?" If you have answered "yes" in the past, how did that happen?

Question: If Jesus has opened the door for you, how can you open the door for others to find Jesus?
