**Question:** What would you undo in your life if you could turn back time?

**Read** John 11:1-20

**Read** Genesis 2:16–17

**Read** John 11:21–26

**Question:** How do you respond to the most important question Jesus ever asked: "Do you believe this?" (John 11:27)

**The litmus test is the same now as it was then.
