Questions: Was there ever a tool or kitchen gadget that you used as a child for something that it wasn't intended for? What was your parent's reaction?

Some points to consider in this series:

- The Bible isn't always easy to understand.
- The Bible is written for us, but it's not written to us.
- If we disrespect the historical and cultural distance, we will distort the biblical teaching.

Read 1 Corinthians 6:12–17

Question: What from these verses sounds the same today as it would have back in Corinth?

Some worldviews to consider:

The Corinthian view: It doesn't matter what you do with your body, because your body doesn't really matter.

Plato: Greek Philosopher who lived about 400 years before Christ. He taught a dualistic view of the world and what it is to be human.

Descartes: French Philosopher of 18th century. "I think, therefore I am". The mind is what makes you human.

A Christian worldview and understanding of the body:

- you don't just have a body, you are a body
- your body belongs to the Lord
- what you do in your body is not meaningless

Sexual immorality: The Greek word is *Porneia*. *Porneia* is all forms of sex outside of a marriage relationship. Marriage is clearly understood as an exclusive relationship between one man and one woman. **Read** Matthew 19:3-6

Our relationship with Jesus is not just spiritual. It's about how you live in your body moment by moment.
