## **Read** 1 Corinthians 10

Freedom isn't just for you, It is ultimately meant for God's glory.

Three Takeaways from 1 Corinthians 10:

- 1. God's gifts don't guarantee your success (v. 1-4)
- 2. Good beginnings don't guarantee good endings (v. 5-12)
- 3. Temptation is inevitable, but God guarantees He'll be faithful (v. 13)

**Question:** When you think of temptation and your experience with it, how do you view it?

Instead of seeing temptation as a sign of weakness:

- See it as God's tool for your transformation.
- See it as God making room in your life for more of him and less of you.
- See it as God's way to dig out the weeds and rocks of your soul.
- See it as God making things better for you, not worse.
- See it as necessary, not inconvenient.

**Questions:** How does seeing temptation in this way shift your view? How may it impact your experience?
