Throughout scripture, water is a symbol of spiritual life. **Read** Psalm 42:1; 63:1; Isaiah 12:3; John 4:7-10, 13-14

What we can learn from Isaac, the well digger:

• Just because you found water doesn't mean everyone is going to like it.

Question: When has someone "kicked dirt into your well"?

Read Genesis 26:17–18

- Each generation needs to re-dig the well.
- When you dig a well, you're serving the next generation.

Read Genesis 26:19

• Teach others to dig wells.

Read Genesis 26:20

• It's easy to argue about who owns the well.

We need to put down our preferences and pick up our shovels!

Read Genesis 26:32

• Wells don't happen by themselves; they need to be dug.

But those who drink the water I give them will never be thirsty again. It becomes a fresh, bubbling spring within them, giving them eternal life.
